Facilities for the youths update	<p>Multi Use Games Area started 8th February and will come to fruition by the end of March. £100,000 secured through the Norton Foundation for extension at the Pavilion. Another £75,000 has also been received for the scheme.</p>
Winter Gritting	<p>A question was raised at the full County Council meeting on the 18th May and the Leader of the Council Cllr Alan Farnell said: "A review is being undertaken and it is expected to be completed by the Autumn. All parishes and those schools who have made representations to the Highway Authority will be consulted. Routes to hospitals will also be included in the review."</p> <p>21/09/10</p> <p>All parishes asked for their views and a positive response received via a questionnaire. No primary route changes but useful feedback received from Bidford and the need for gritters to go an extra distance on Honeybourne Road.</p> <p>Secondary routes include Dunnington to Broom and Pettiford Lane, Wootton Wawen.</p> <p>Primary routes will be published early October and sent to Parishes and the secondary routes will be on the web later that month.</p>
