BURGLARY DWELLING

Between 08:30 hours and 18:20 hours on Thursday 22nd December unknown offender/s have gained entry to a premises, possibly via a first floor window, on Quineys Leys, Welford on Avon. Offender/s have stolen numerous amounts of jewellery and other property from within before making off in an unknown direction.

AUTOCRIME

At approximately 04:15 hours on Monday 12th December unknown offender/s have smashed the window of a Mitsubishi L200 Warrior motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Church Bank, Temple Grafton. The vehicles car alarm has activated and offender/s have made off from the scene in an unknown direction. No entry to the vehicle was gained.

Between 22:00 hours on Thursday 8th December and 07:15 hours on Friday 9th December unknown offender/s have gained entry to a VW Beetle motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Hill View Road, Bidford, by forcing the front door lock. Offender/s have stolen approximately 60 CDs from within.

Between 23:30 hours on Saturday 10th December and 02:30 hours on Sunday 11th December unknown offender/s have smashed the rear windscreen of a vehicle parked secure and unattended on Grafton Lane, Bidford. The two offender/s have been described as approximately 15/16 years of age and wearing hoodies.

Between 22:20 hours on Thursday 15th December and 08:00 hours on Friday 16th December unknown offender/s have gained entry to a VW Passatt motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Bastyan Avenue, Lower Quinton by unknown means. Offender/s have stolen a satellite navigation system and 6 cases of wine from within.

Between 00:30 hours and 08:00 hours on Saturday 17th December unknown offender/s have forced entry to a Landrover Discovery parked secure and unattended on the High Street, Welford. Offender/s have moved property within the vehicle but nothing has been stolen.

At approximately 03:15 hours on Saturday 17th December unknown offender/s have smashed the window of a Saab motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on the High Street, Welford. No property has been stolen from within.

Between 19:00 hours on Thursday 15th December and 07:30 hours on Friday 16th December unknown offender/s have smashed the window and forced the door lock of a Ford Escort motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on The Fordway, Lower Quinton. Offender/s have searched the vehicle but no property has been stolen.

Web Survey on Policing

Warwickshire Police has launched an online survey to find out what the public thinks about its Police Community Support Officers.

The survey that was launched on Thursday 1st December last for one month and will ask questions such as how often would residents like to see PCSO's patrolling.

Dave Shirley, PCSO manager said "we are encouraging as many people as possible to take part because the responses will help us decided how to use PCSO's in the future." We need to know what people think of PCSO's now and how they can better support communities in the future. We will also be asking questions internally of supervisors and other staff who interact with PCSO's as well as the PCSO's themselves to help improve the way they work."

Warwickshire Police was one of the first forces to employ Police Community Support Officers in December 2002 following a Home Office Study revealing that a more visual Police presence was required.
