BURGLARY DWELLING

At an unknown time on Monday 27th March an unknown male offender has called at the door of a premises on School Close, Great Alne selling dusters, which the owner of the premises has then purchased.

A short time later this male has returned to the premises stating that he has left something behind, he has then been let into the premises to claim the forgotten item. The offender has then stated that he has found this item and left the premises. A short while later a purse containing £150.00 and various cards have been discovered missing. BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING

Sometime before 09:19 hours on Monday 27th March unknown offender/s have gained entry to a commercial premises in Long Marston by unknown means. Once inside offender/s have proceeded to cause damage to approximately 20 cars within before making good their escape in an unknown direction.

AUTOCRIME

Between 20:00 hours on Sunday 26th March and 10:00 hours on Monday 27th March unknown offender/s have approached a Chunlan Motor Scooter parked secure and unattended on Bryan Mews, Bidford and have proceeded to steal same by unknown means.

Between 22:30 hours and 22:45 hours on Saturday 25th March unknown offender/s have smashed the front passenger window of a Ford Escort motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Perkins Close, Salford Priors by throwing a house brick through the same.

Incident number 10 of 26th March refers

Between 00:01 hours and 08:30 hours on Tuesday 28th March unknown offender/s have approached a Citroen panel van parked secure and unattended on Aston Cantlow Road, Wilmcote and have proceeded to smash the front window of the vehicle by unknown means. Offender/s have also tried forcing the drivers door lock to gain entry. Offender/s have then reached in through the window and stolen a black plastic box containing numerous hand and power tools before making good their escape.

Incident number 385 of 28th March refers

Between 19:45 hours and 21:30 hours on Wednesday 29th March unknown offender/s have smashed the window of a motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Wixford Road, Bidford by unknown means. Offender/s have then reached in and stolen a laptop computer from within before making good their escape in an unknown direction.

Incident number 632 of 29th March refers

Between 13:30 hours and 14:30 hours on Saturday 1st April unknown offender/s have approached a Rover 216 Motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on the Leys, Bidford and have proceeded to use bodily force to kick and damage the bodywork and lights of the vehicle.

Incident number 351 of 1st April refers

Between 12:00 hours on Tuesday 28th March and 18:00 hours on Friday 31st March unknown offender/s have approached a VW Golf motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Goose Lane, Lower Quinton and have proceeded to remove one of the vehicle wheel trims before making good their escape.

Incident number 552 of 31st March refers

Between 18:30 hours on Monday 3rd April and 08:00 hours on Tuesday 4th April unknown offender/s have smashed the window of a motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on Bramley Way, Bidford by unknown means. Offender/s have then reached through, pulled down rear seats and stole a black plastic portable filing cabinet from within before making off in an unknown direction.

Incident number 239 of 4th April refers

Between 00:01 hours and 07:30 hours on Tuesday 4th April unknown offender/s have smashed the rear windscreen of a Volvo XC 90 motor vehicle parked secure and unattended on St. Laurence Way, Bidford by unknown means. Offender/s have then reached in through the window and removed a laptop computer from within.

Incident number 181 of 4th April refers

Between 23:00 hours on Monday 3rd April and 06:00 hours on Tuesday 4th April unknown offender/s have forced the door skin of a Mercedes Sprinter Panel van parked secure and unattended on Blenheim Close, Bidford by unknown means. An untidy search of the vehicle has been made, however no property has been stolen from within. Incident number 366 of 4th April refers

Between 23:00 hours on Monday 3rd April and 08:30 hours on Tuesday 4th April unknown offender/s have forced the drivers door lock of a VW Beetle parked secure and unattended on Bramley Way, Bidford by unknown means. Once inside offender/s have stolen a clothing bag containing magazines from within before making off in an unknown direction. Incident number 438 of 6th April refers



CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Sometime before 17:17 hours on Saturday 25th March unknown offender/s have broken three panes of glass within a greenhouse on an allotment premises on Back Lane, Lower Quinton. Incident number 422 of 25th March refers



THEFT

Between 12:00 hours on Sunday 26th March and 09:00 hours on Monday 27th March unknown offender/s have gained entry to a compound on the Honeybourne Road, Bidford by unknown means. Once inside offender/s have gained entry to a Coahman Pastiche Caravan within and have proceeded to steal a radio and numerous other items before making good their escape in an unknown direction. WARWICKSHIRE POLICE RESPONSE TIMES

Warwickshire Police defines an immediate response incident as one where there is a danger/threat to life or property or where an offence has been committed and the offender/s are still in the locality.

Warwickshire Police are measured on all of our immediate response incidents and are

required to attend 90% of these incidents within a 20-minute period. Many of the

immediate incidents reported to us are however dealt with much quicker.

In the 2005/2006 period a total of 7,735 incidents were reported on the Alcester Policing sector. 227 immediate response incidents were reported in Bidford, during this period, with 95.07% of these being reached within the target time. In Great Alne 117 immediate response incidents were reported with 93.04% of these being reached within the target

time and 100 incidents being reported in Long Marston with 91.67% of these being reached within the target time.
