



BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL

In the County of Warwickshire



This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud. Week ending Friday 20th October 2006

BURGLARY DWELLING

At approximately 1400 hours on 19th October 06 two offenders approached a property on Glebe Estate, Wilmcote. They then walked through a wooden gate and gained entry via an unlocked kitchen door. Once inside they removed a quantity of cash from a safety box kept underneath the bed. Offenders described as both white, male, one with straight black hair, one with brown curly hair. Both approximately twenty years of age. Incident number 303 of 19th October 06 refers.



BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING

Between 0830 hours and 1830 hours on 19th October unknown offender/s approached a property in Irons Cross, Salford Priors. They then approached a brick shed in the rear garden via an unlocked gate. They gained access by removing the door panels to the shed. Once inside they have stolen a Mountfield petrol lawn mower. Incident number 533 of 19th October 06 refers.



AUTOCRIME

Between 0030 hours and 1030 hours on 11th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked on St. Laurence Way, Bidford. They then gained entry by unknown means and removed same.

Incident number 207 of 11th October 06 refers.

At approximately 0200 hours on 18th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on Old School Road, Bidford. They gained access to the driveway through solid wooden gates. Offender/s have then pushed the vehicle off the drive and started it a short distance away. They were seen making off towards Broom.

Incident number 32 of 18th October 06 refers.



CRIMINAL DAMAGE



THEFT

Between some time on 1st October 06 and 0800 hours on 2nd October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on Welford Road, Long Marston. They then removed a portion of roadside stall, together with empty money box. The spare wheel of an Isuzu Trooper was also taken.

Incident number 609 of 15th October 06 refers.

Between 1720 hours on 8th October 06 and 0330 hours on 9th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked on School Road, Salford Priors. They then gained entry by smashing the off side front window. Once inside they have stolen the Sat Nav unit, charger and cradle.

Incident number 32 of 9th October 06 refers.

Between 1900 hours on 8th October 06 and 0845 hours on 9th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a Ford Focus parked on Priors Grange, Salford Priors. They have then gained access by unknown means and stolen a CD charger and radio from the dash.

Incident number 107 of 9th October 06 refers.

Prior to 9th October 06 unknown offender/s approached business premises at Pitchill, Evesham. They then gained entry to an outside yard. Once inside they have stolen a Japanese patio set (with dragons on it), two lion statues and an empty bird aviary.

Incident number 620 of 9th October 06 refers.

Prior to 9th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a caravan site on Binton Road, Welford on Avon. They have then removed a trailer and yellow/green Annermann compacting plate.

Incident number 444 of 9th October 06 refers.

Overnight between 9th October 06 and 10th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a van parked on School Road, Salford Priors. They gained entry by moving a glass sheet from the rear of the vehicle. Once inside they have taken a quantity of tools.
Incident number 67 of 9th October 06 refers.

Between 2230 hours on 10th October 06 and 0800 hours on 11th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a blue Peugeot 206 parked on School Avenue, Salford Priors. They then gained access by forcing the front passenger door lock. Once inside they have stolen a Sat Nav charger and mobile phone from the glovebox.
Incident number 255 of 11th October 06 refers.

Between 1415 hours and 1700 hours on 12th October 06 unknown offender/s have approached a yard opposite Grafton Lane, Bidford on Avon. They have then stolen an Ifor Williams 3 tonne trailer. Trailer is sign written David Fisher Landscapes on rear and Q Lawns in the Midlands on the sides.
Incident number 470 of 12th October 06 refers.

Overnight between 12th October 06 and 13th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a VW Passat parked on Tothall Lane, Salford Priors. They then gained entry by forcing the lock on front off side door. Once inside they have stolen a JVC video camera and a handbag.
Incident number 95 of 13th October 06 refers.

Prior to 13th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a blue Ford Explorer Estate parked on School Road, Salford Priors. They then punched the door lock to gain entry. Nothing believed stolen.
Incident number 46 of 13th October 06 refers.

Prior to 19th October 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on Long Marston Road, Welford on Avon. They have then stolen a yellow/silver framed mountain bike.
Incident number 223 of 19th October 06 refers.



 **BE AWARE**

Inspector Ayers attended the Studley Parish Council meeting and was happy to report a 15% reduction in Anti Social behaviour incidents for the same period year to date than last year. There is further work planned to combat the run-up to Halloween and Bonfire Night, to include enhanced visible police presence over half-term school holidays. The schools have agreed to send letters home to parents to help monitor what youths are taking out with them, e.g. eggs for throwing etc. If they are found with, these will be taken off them.

The Trading Standards Office have advised of the following scam. A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (parcel delivery service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a premium rate number). **DO NOT CALL THIS NUMBER** as this is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call this number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed for £15 for the phone call. If you do receive a card with these details, please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 0207 239 6655 or ICTIS (the premium rate service regulator) at [http: www.icstis.org.co.uk](http://www.icstis.org.co.uk) or your local Trading Standards Office. **THIS IS A GENUINE SCAM.**

If you have any information or have witnessed the above incidents, please can you contact Alcester Police on 01789 762207. Thank you. **Please note Alcester Police station is temporarily based at the former Alcester Infant School, Moorfield Road, Alcester (towards Somerfield).**

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.

 **CRIMESTOPPERS**

If you did have information regarding the displayed incidents, but for whatever reason do not wish to contact the police directly, then you can ring 0800 555 111 and give the information to the Crimestoppers Charity. Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
