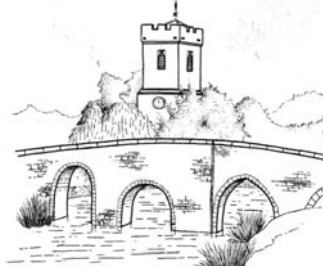


BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL

This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud. Week ending Friday 1st December 2006

AUTOCRIME

Between 1030 hours and 1230 hours on 26th November 06 unknown offender/s have stolen a purple Ford Escort parked on Campden Road, Lower Quinton. Incident number 354 of 26th November 06 refers.



CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Between 0900 hours on 25th November and 1100 hours on 27th November 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on The Bank, Marlcliff, Bidford on Avon. They have then deliberately rammed a metal gate causing damage. Incident number 212 of 27th November 06 refers.

Between 1200 hours on 25th October and 1530 hours on 18th November 06 unknown offender/s approached a wooden holiday chalet on Barton Road, Welford on Avon. They then gained entry by sawing through the hasp. Nothing believed stolen. Incident number 416 of 18th November 06 refers.

At approximately 2140 hours on 26th November 06 an offender approached a property on The Leys, Bidford on Avon. He was then seen using a stick to smack the garden Christmas decorations. Offender described as male, aged 14 years, wearing dark track suit bottoms and light blue/grey hoody top.
Incident number 671 of 26th November 06 refers.

At approximately 1855 hours on 28th November 06 offender/s approached a property on Goose Lane, Lower Quinton. They then threw missiles at the roof and guttering causing damage.
Incident number 240 of 29th November 06 refers.



THEFT

Between 1630 hours and 1730 hours on 13th November 06 unknown offender/s approached a white Partner van left insecure on Waterloo Road, Bidford on Avon. They have then stolen a Nokia mobile phone.
Incident number 76 of 23rd November 06 refers.

Between 2200 hours on 16th November and 1130 hours on 17th November 06 unknown offender/s approached the front garden of a property on High Street, Welford on Avon. They have then stolen a stone table and six box trees in clay pots.
Incident number 242 of 17th November 06 refers.

Between 1900 hours on 23rd November and 1000 hours on 24th November 06 unknown offender/s approached the front garden of a property on Wyre Lane, Long Marston. They have then stolen two large terracotta pots.
Incident number 283 of 26th November 06 refers.

Between 1100 hours on 25th November and 0800 hours on 27th November 06 unknown offender/s approached business premises on Beech Tree Park, Bidford on Avon. They have then stolen a green wheelie bin marked Grendon.
Incident number 196 of 29th November 06 refers.

Between 1500 hours and 2100 hours on 29th November 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked on Quinneys Lane, Bidford on Avon. They then gained entry by smashing the front off side window. Once inside they have stolen a Sat Nav and phone charger from glove box.
Incident number 94 of 30th November 06 refers.





BE AWARE

In the last couple of weeks an offender was arrested for various offences from robbery to Class A drugs. During the search of the property five commemorative £5 coins were found, which I believed were from the Stratford Area. At the present time the police have been unable to identify exactly where these coins have come from. If anybody knows of a burglary where these coins have been taken, please could they contact Alcester police.

The 21st November saw the official launch of the Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT) in Alcester, together with a new mobile police station. This police station will be used on a regular basis in the remote villages to provide high visibility and reassurance for the communities. Also at the SNT press launch were other partners and children from St. Nicholas School, together with the Deputy Chief Constable, Andy Parker. DCC Parker was very impressed with the turnout at the launch and commented on how well we are working together in partnership.

A resident reported that he had received a letter through the post to inform him that he had 'won' a television. The consumer was asked to send off £29.99 to claim his 'prize'. The Trading Standards Service advised him that this was probably a scam and that anything he received was likely to be worth less than the £29.99 fee he had been asked to pay.

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.

CRIMESTOPPERS

If you did have information regarding the displayed incidents, but for whatever reason do not wish to contact the police directly, then you can ring 0800 555 111 and give the information to the Crimestoppers Charity. Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
