



# **BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL**

## **In the County of Warwickshire**



This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud. Week ending 15<sup>th</sup> December 2006

### **BURGLARY DWELLING**

At approximately 2350 hours on 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 an offender approached a property on Salford Road, Bidford. He then gained entry by smashing the front window. A male was subsequently arrested and questioned in connection with the incident.

Incident number 666 of 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.



### **BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING**

Some time during the evening of 2<sup>nd</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached building plots on Waterloo Road, Bidford on Avon. They have then entered several plots and stolen a quantity of unknown items.

Incident number 92 of 4<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1700 hours on 9<sup>th</sup> December and 0800 hours on 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a farm on Stratford Road, Bidford. They then gained entry to the garden centre by smashing a door window and forcing the padlock. Once inside a quantity of food has been stolen.

Incident number 211 of 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Overnight between 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached business premises in Pitchill, Evesham. They have then cut the rear fence to allow vehicle access to yard area and stolen a 5' x 4' bronze statue of horse.  
Incident number 264 of 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.



### **AUTOCRIME**

Between 1830 hours and 1920 hours on 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s have approached a property on Marleigh Road, Bidford on Avon. They have then stolen from the front drive a blue Yamaha moped which had been left with steering lock on.  
Incident number 522 of 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

At around midnight on 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s have approached a property on Grafton Lane, Bidford and stolen a blue and silver Mitsubishi Shogun.  
Incident number 5 of 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.



### **CRIMINAL DAMAGE**

At approximately 1950 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> December 06 a group of youths caused damage to a property on Quinneys Lane, Bidford. They also damaged a car at the property.  
Incident number 507 of 12<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.



### **THEFT**

Between 1000 hours on 19<sup>th</sup> November and 1600 hours on 26<sup>th</sup> November 06 unknown offender/s have stolen a mill stone from a property on Wyre Lane, Long Marston.  
Incident number 136 of 1<sup>st</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 2300 hours on 6<sup>th</sup> December and 0730 hours on 7<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a black VW motor vehicle parked on Marsh Road, Wilmcote. They then gained entry by inserting an instrument between tailgate and rear window and applying enough pressure to break windscreen. Once inside they have stolen a large black business case.  
Incident number 104 of 7<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1230 hours and 1300 hours on 7<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a silver Ford Focus Estate parked on Campden Road, Clifford Chambers. They then gained entry by smashing the rear window. Nothing believed stolen.  
Incident number 269 of 7<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1700 hours on 8<sup>th</sup> December and 0730 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s have stolen an Ifor Williams trailer from rear of business unit in Clifford Chambers, Stratford on Avon.

Incident number 220 of 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1300 hours on 9<sup>th</sup> December and 0730 hours on 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked on Binton Road, Welford on Avon. They have then smashed both rear lamp plastic casings and stolen flasher bulbs and fog light bulbs.

Incident number 352 of 11<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1600 hours on 9<sup>th</sup> December and 1030 hours on 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s have stolen 2 stone dogs from front of property on The Bank, Bidford on Avon.

Incident number 152 of 12<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 2045 hours on 9<sup>th</sup> December and 1030 hours on 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a property on Goose Lane, Lower Quinton and removed a 4' metal garden gate and post.

Incident number 345 of 10<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 2000 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> December and 0800 hours on 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle parked in Abbots Salford, Evesham. They then gained entry by smashing the off side and near side front windows. Once inside they have stolen Garmin Sat Nav system and computer bag containing electronic equipment.

Incident number 103 of 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.

Between 1930 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> December and 0730 hours on 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 unknown offender/s approached a silver Ford Transit parked in Abbots Salford, Evesham. They then gained entry by smashing the front off side quarter light, reaching through and opening the door. Once inside they have stolen a Tom Tom Sat Nav system from under the front seat and digital compact camera.

Incident number 106 of 13<sup>th</sup> December 06 refers.



**BE AWARE**

**The definition of anti-social behaviour in Section 1 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 – “behaviour which causes or is likely to cause harrassment, alarm or distress to one or more people who are not in the same household as the perpetrator”.**

**Anti-social behaviour (ASB) can therefore cover a wide range of activities, from those that cause minor nuisance or irritation to major incidents of harrassment, threats or actual acts of violence.**

**Individual incidents of ASB may be dealt with by means of Warning Letters, ABCs and ASBOs.**

**There are 0 ASB cases, 2 Warning Letters, 0 ABCs and 0 ASBOs active in Bidford.**

**Operation Sanction was run on 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> December 06. The Operation consisted of arrests, high visibility patrols and a vehicle crime operation in an area where we are experiencing a high volume of crimes. During the Operation 28 people were formally interviewed or arrested and 28 crimes were detected. This was a huge success which involved over 20 Police Officers from the district. This was compared with Warwick District's result of 29 interviews/arrests and 10 detections. This goes towards our commitment to bring people to justice and consequently reduce crime trends.**

**We are pleased to announce Gareth Walton, PCSO for Studley, was presented with an award by Studley Parish Council for outstanding service to the community. Gareth and I are very proud he has managed this after only doing the job for seven months. This is an excellent achievement.**

**We, at Alcester and Henley police, would like to extend our warm wishes and hope that everybody has a peaceful Christmas and a Happy New Year. We would like to also thank all our partners and members of the community who have helped us achieve our performance levels during 2006 and look forward to their continued support in 2007.**

**A member of the public recently received a letter to say he had 'won' a prize. He telephoned an 090 premium rate line number which lasted 7 minutes and cost him over £9.00. He was then told he had 'won' a digital camera and was asked to send a stamped addressed envelope. This done he then received a letter informing him that if he send £6.60 and a further £3.50 for postage and packaging he would receive his 'free' prize. The matter is being investigated.**

**In the past couple of days Warwickshire Trading Standards has received several calls alerting them to the activities of a rogue tarmac gang working door to door in the Tiddington, Stratford area. Work is reported to have been shoddy and the men are falsely claiming to be working for Warwickshire County Council.**

**The Trading Standards Office have advised of the following scam. A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (parcel delivery service) suggesting that**

they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a premium rate number). DO NOT CALL THIS NUMBER as this is a mail scam originating from Belize. If you call this number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed for £15 for the phone call. If you do receive a card with these details, please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 0207 239 6655 or ICTIS (the premium rate service regulator) at [http: www.icstis.org.co.uk](http://www.icstis.org.co.uk) or your local Trading Standards Office. THIS IS A GENUINE SCAM.

If you have any information or have witnessed the above incidents, please can you contact Alcester Police on 01789 762207. Thank you. **Please note Alcester Police station is temporarily based at the former Alcester Infant School, Moorfield Road, Alcester (towards Somerfield).**

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.



If you did have information regarding the displayed incidents, but for whatever reason do not wish to contact the police directly, then you can ring 0800 555 111 and give the

information to the Crimestoppers Charity. Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
