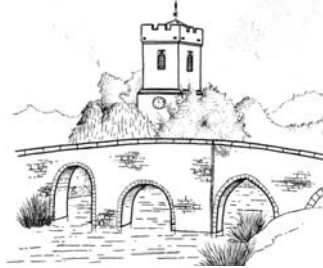


BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL

In the County of Warwickshire



This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud. Week ending 2nd February 2007



BURGLARY DWELLING

Overnight between 25th and 26th January 07 unknown offender/s approached a property on Barton Road, Welford on Avon. They have then gained entry and stolen flat screen TV, jewellery and silverware.

Incident number 182 of 26th January 07 refers.



BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING

Between 1900 hours on 9th December and 0730 hours on 10th December 06 unknown offender/s approached a garage near to farm shop at Weston on Avon, Stratford. They have then forced the door lock and stolen sacks of vegetables and waterproof clothing from within.

Incident number 139 of 23rd January 07 refers.

Overnight between 27th and 28th January 07 unknown offender/s have gained entry to a church on main road, Lower Quinton. Not known if anything stolen.

Incident number 235 of 28th January 07 refers.



AUTOCRIME



CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Between 1230 hours on 18th January and 0845 hours on 19th January 07 unknown offender/s approached a Ford Focus parked on Crompton Avenue, Bidford. They have then damaged the front near side wing mirror.
Incident number 103 of 19th January 07 refers.

Prior to 1000 hours on 22nd January 07 unknown offender/s have approached a school on Main Road, Lower Quinton and damaged a ground floor window.
Incident number 127 of 22nd January 07 refers.

At 0030 hours on 28th January 07 unknown offender/s approached a Vauxhall Zafira parked on High Street, Bidford. They have then damaged the near side door mirror.
Incident number 359 of 28th January 07 refers.



THEFT

Between 1800 hours on 19th January and 2100 hours on 21st January 07 unknown offender/s approached an industrial unit in Long Marston, Stratford. They have then used a cutter/grinder to enter secure gates and stolen a quantity of scrap metal.
Incident number 150 of 22nd January 07 refers.

Between 1600 hours on 29th January and 1030 hours on 30th January 07 unknown offender/s approached a Bedford lorry parked adjacent to farm in Irons Cross, Salford Priors. They have then stolen the lorry battery from under the chassis.
Incident number 200 of 30th January 07 refers.

The definition of anti-social behaviour in Section 1 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 – “behaviour which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more people who are not in the same household as the perpetrator”.

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) can therefore cover a wide range of activities, from those that cause minor nuisance or irritation to major incidents of harassment, threats or actual acts of violence.

Individual incidents of ASB may be dealt with by means of Warning Letters, ABCs and ASBOs.

There are 0 ASB cases, 5 Advisory Letters, 9 Warning Letters, 0 ABCs and 0 ASBOs active in Bidford.

If you have any information or have witnessed the above incidents, please can you contact Alcester Police on 01789 762207. Thank you. **Please note Alcester Police station is temporarily based at the former Alcester Infant School, Moorfield Road, Alcester (towards Somerfield).**

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an ‘incident number’ – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such

incidents are ‘managed’ and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.

CRIMESTOPPERS

If you did have information regarding the displayed incidents, but for whatever reason do not wish to contact the police directly, then you can ring 0800 555 111 and give the information to the Crimestoppers Charity. Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
