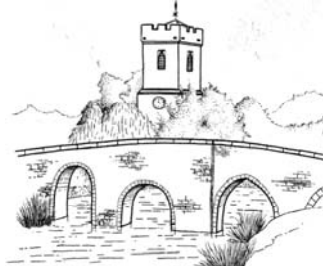


# **BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL**

### **BURGLARY DWELLING**



### **BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING**

Overnight between 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> June 07 unknown offender/s have approached public toilets at The Big Meadow, Bidford and caused damage to the interior. Incident number 187 of 29<sup>th</sup> June 07 refers.



### **AUTOCRIME**

Prior to 1500 hours on 6<sup>th</sup> July 07 unknown offender/s approached a property on School Road, Salford Priors. They have then gained entry via an insecure rear ground floor window. Nothing believed stolen as offender/s probably disturbed by occupant's dog. Incident number 415 of 6<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.

Between 1930 hours on 11<sup>th</sup> July and 0730 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 unknown offender/s approached a property on St. Laurence Way, Bidford. They have then stolen an MG TF motor vehicle from the driveway. Incident number 91 of 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.



## CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Between 1900 hours on 15<sup>th</sup> June and 0700 hours on 16<sup>th</sup> June 07 unknown offender/s approached a black Skoda parked on Bastyan Avenue, Lower Quinton. They have then scratched both the door panel and bonnet.  
Incident number 192 of 6<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.

At 0045 hours on 29<sup>th</sup> June 07 a male offender approached a property on The Orchard, Wilmcote. He has then used an air rifle to shoot out the bulbs on exterior gate lights.  
Incident number 145 of 3<sup>rd</sup> July 07 refers.

Between 1800 hours on 2<sup>nd</sup> July and 0815 hours on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 07 unknown offender/s have approached ladies' toilets on Honeybourne Road, Bidford and caused damage to the female changing rooms.  
Incident number 327 of 3<sup>rd</sup> July 07 refers.

At approximately 1930 hours on 10<sup>th</sup> July 07 offenders approached business premises on Campden Road, Lower Quinton. They have then gained access to the roof and appear to have been jumping up and down on it in an attempt to gain entry to building.  
Incident number 265 of 10<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.



## THEFT

Between 1200 hours on 11<sup>th</sup> July and 0900 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 unknown offender/s approached a white Mercedes Sprinter van parked on hotel car park in Abbots Salford, Evesham. They have then gained entry and stolen Clarion Sat Nav system.  
Incident number 142 of 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.

Between 1050 hours and 1140 hours on 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 offenders approached a property on The Close, Lower Quinton. They have then approached a shed and removed three adult ferrets from a pen within. Ferrets described as two 'polecat' females, black with bit of white on nose and one male, white with red eyes. One offender described as white male, about 5'10" tall, stocky build, short ginger hair, freckled face, blue eyes, wearing white shirt and denim jeans.  
Incident number 261 of 12<sup>th</sup> July 07 refers.

The definition of anti-social behaviour in Section 1 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 – "behaviour which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more people who are not in the same household as the perpetrator".

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) can therefore cover a wide range of activities, from those that cause minor nuisance or irritation to major incidents of harassment, threats or actual acts of violence.

Individual incidents of ASB may be dealt with by means of Warning Letters, ABCs and ASBOs.

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.

## **CRIMESTOPPERS**

If you did have information regarding the displayed incidents, but for whatever reason do not wish to contact the police directly, then you can ring 0800 555 111 and give the information to the Crimestoppers Charity. Crimestoppers will then pass the information to the Police without revealing any details of the caller. You may also receive a reward.
