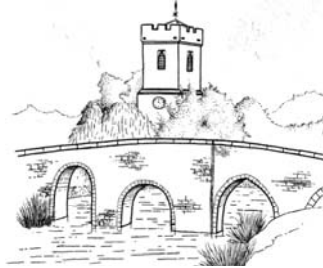


BIDFORD ON AVON PARISH COUNCIL

Wednesday 6th February 2008

This crime summary is a look at the crimes of public interest that occurred on the Bidford, Great Alne and Long Marston policing area over the last 14 days. We do not as normal practice include crimes of shoplifting, bilking, domestic violence or fraud

BURGLARY DWELLING

Overnight between 25th and 26th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a property at The Poplars, Bidford. They have then gained entry to an insecure conservatory. Incident 507 of 26th January 08 refers.



BURGLARY COMMERCIAL AND OTHER BUILDING

Between 1200 hours on 19th January and 0800 hours on 20th January 08 unknown offender/s approached premises on Goose Lane, Lower Quinton. They then pulled fencing apart and attempted to force the lock on a steel container. Offender/s approached same location between 1630 hours on 21st January and 0800 hours on 22nd January and caused graffiti damage.

Between 1800 hours on 26th January and 0620 hours on 27th January 08 unknown offender/s approached premises at Weston on Avon, Stratford. They then forced the padlocks to secure doors and removed an International Harvester tractor. The tractor was later recovered nearby. Incident 162 of 27th January 08 refers.

Between 29th January and 1st February 08 unknown offender/s approached premises on Grafton Lane, Bidford and removed a red Sumson petrol generator. Incident 150 of 2nd February 08 refers.

Between 0140 hours and 0220 hours on 31st January 08 unknown offender/s approached business premises on Station Road, Salford Priors. They have then broken the clasps off the doors to shipping containers in the yard.

Incident 214 of 31st January 08 refers.

Between 2000 hours on 2nd February and 1000 hours on 3rd February 08 unknown offender/s approached premises in Braggington, Stratford. They have then parked a vehicle at the rear of the property and broken off locks to workshops. Offender/s then removed a large quantity of tools and machinery including three power washers, John Deer lawn mower, wacker plates, cement mixer and chain saw.

AUTOCRIME

At around 1730 hours on 24th January 08 a white Gilera moped bicycle was stolen from Thackeray Close, Lower Quinton. A youth was later arrested in connection with the theft.

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Between 0800 hours on 14th January and 0800 hours on 22nd January 08 unknown offender/s approached a school building on Main Road, Lower Quinton and caused damage to items of property.

Incident 263 of 22nd January 08 refers.

Between 1400 hours and 1700 hours on 24th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a property in Lower Quinton. They then caused damage to lighting on driveway.

Incident 190 of 25th January 08 refers.

Prior to 25th January 08 three youths knocked over a wall at Falcon Crescent, Bidford.

Incident 624 of 25th January 08 refers.

Between 1100 hours on 25th January and 2115 hours on 27th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a green Vauxhall Astra on The Leys, Bidford and caused damage to the bodywork.

Incident 554 of 27th January 08 refers.

Between 1700 hours on 25th January and 0830 hours on 26th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on The Leys, Bidford and caused damage to the bodywork.

Incident 241 of 26th January 08 refers.

Between 1730 hours on 25th January and 0900 hours on 26th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on Wessons Road, Bidford and caused damage to the headlight and driver's door.

Incident 213 of 26th January 08 refers.

Between 1800 hours on 25th January and 0900 hours on 26th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on The Leys, Bidford and caused damage to the bodywork.

Incident 223 of 26th January 08 refers.

Between 1800 hours on 25th January and 0730 hours on 27th January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on The Leys, Bidford and caused damage to the bodywork.

Incident 429 of 27th January 08 refers.



THEFT

Between 1st December and 31st December 07 unknown offender/s approached business premises at Irons Cross, Salford Priors and removed agricultural equipment from a compound.

Incident 154 of 31st January 08 refers.

Between 2100 hours on 18th January and 1500 hours on 22nd January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on Pear Tree Close, Long Marston. They then forced the lock and removed a Stihl saw and Bosch drill from within.

Incident 329 of 22nd January 08 refers.

Between 21st January and 30th January 08 unknown offender/s made several visits to premises in Dorsington, Stratford and removed copper cylinders and copper piping.

Incident 428 of 30th January 08 refers.

Between 27th January and 3rd February 08 unknown offender/s approached a narrow boat on Wharf Lane, Wilmcote. They then forced entry into the boat and removed some cash.

Incident 313 of 3rd February 08 refers.

Overnight between 30th and 31st January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on Priors Grange, Salford Priors. They then smashed the rear windscreen and removed Makita drills from within.

Incident 328 of 31st January 08 refers.

Between 0300 hours and 0640 hours on 31st January 08 unknown offender/s approached a motor vehicle on Ridsdale Close, Salford Priors. They then smashed the front passenger window to gain entry and removed a silver Ipod player from within.

Incident 108 of 31st January 08 refers.

Between 2030 hours on 31st January and 0700 hours on 1st February 08 unknown offender/s approached premises on Campden Road, Lower Quinton. They have then boltcropped the padlock and chain linking a trailer to a motorhome and removed the trailer. Trailer is white and has pictures of a cartoon character with a man running with a suitcase on both sides of it.

The Service has received a report about the activities of some individuals who are knocking on people's doors in the Nuneaton area falsely claiming to be from Warwickshire Trading Standards. Trading Standards Officers are also warning that there is a possibility that this approach is being used by rogue tradespeople returning to properties they have visited previously and done 'work' at. On their return, and posing as a Trading Standards Officer, they then claim that they can reimburse the householder the money they have already lost by taking them to a bank.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

The definition of anti-social behaviour in Section 1 of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 – "behaviour which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more people who are not in the same household as the perpetrator".

Anti-social behaviour (ASB) can therefore cover a wide range of activities, from those that cause minor nuisance or irritation to major incidents of harassment, threats or actual acts of violence.

Individual incidents of ASB may be dealt with by means of Warning Letters, ABCs and ASBOs.

All to note a Public Service Desk at Headquarters is now operational. The Public Service Desk (PSD) is designed to put Police Officers back in the control room, thus enabling a better service delivery to members of the public wishing to speak to a Police Officer on any matter which does not necessarily need Police deployment. Anybody wishing to speak to the Police about any issue that does not require a Police Officer to attend can do so via this Desk. Contacting any of the Police station telephone numbers will direct you to the switchboard where you can then ask for the Public Service Desk.

We are often asked the best way to report an incident or to make contact with a Police officer. Should a member of the public witness or be affected by a crime whereby there is a threat of injury, injury or damage or theft of property and the incident is ongoing and offenders are still at the scene, they should ring 999, classed as an emergency or an immediate response incident.

Should the incident have already occurred and is not ongoing, for example waking up and find your car has been broken into, you should ring one of the normal Police station numbers and ask to report a crime or an incident. You will be put through to the force control room or the crime desk. Please ask for an 'incident number' – you should be given one. If a crime has been committed against you, you will be given a crime reference number by the crime desk or by the officer who attends the incident. Such incidents are 'managed' and you should be given an indication of when an officer can attend.

If you wish to speak to an officer about a non-urgent matter, please use the list of contacts, which are always included in our newsletters.

Hopefully the Public Help Desk will help members of the public when they wish to speak to the Police.
