CRIME IN YOUR AREA

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Alcester South Safer Neighbourhood Team policing beat, crimes such as burglary, theft, auto crime and criminal damage:



BURGLARY.

- Burglary Dwellings same as last month and comparable to this time last year but Burglary Others down quite a bit on last month.
- A number of attempted break-ins and actual break ins on garages and sheds on the evening of Sunday 10th October 2010 along Binton Road and High Street, Welford on Avon. On all occasions it was garden equipment that was taken, including strimmers, lawn mowers and chain saws and some fishing tackle from one property.
- Sometime between 21:00hrs on 13th and 08:00 on the 14th October, unknown offenders have gained entry to a garage at a property in Wilmcote and taken 2 McCulloch hedge cutters and a petrol strimmer. Inc 52 of 14th October 2010.



AUTOCRIME.

- Vehicle crimes looking pretty good this month, and good compared to last year.
- No significant incidents worthy of mentioning.



THEFT.

- Sometime between 22:00hrs on the 27th and 08:30hrs on the 28th October 2010, unknown offenders have taken gold painted ornaments which were set in concrete, on gate posts from an address on Castle Road, Alcester, leaving the elderly occupant very shaken up. Inc 150 of 28th October.
- A black mountain bike has been taken from the flats above Tesco's Express in Alcester sometime between 17:00hrs on the 18th Oct and 16:00hrs on 21st Oct. Inc 258 of 21st October 2010.



CRIMINAL DAMAGE.

- Incidents down on the previous month with nothing of real interest to report.
- During the very early hours of Sunday 10th October a number of "For Sale" boards were smashed up as well as a number of fence panels along Westholme Road and The Crescent in Bidford. The only description is of one of the alleged offenders who had ginger hair and a goatee beard. Inc 54 of 10th October.
- Alne Bank, the special needs day care centre in Alcester has been subject of two separate incidents. Overnight of the 19th October, an attempt has been made to smash the sliding entrance doors, Inc 108 of 20th Oct, and at approximately 1am on the 27th October the same entrance door had its windows broken. Inc 120 of 27th October.

Fatal collision near Alcester

Incident 215, October 10th 2010

A man died when the motorbike he was riding was in collision with a car near Alcester on, Sunday October 10th

The collision occurred at about 13.50hrs on a bend on the B4089 and involved a blue and yellow Suzuki motorbike which was travelling towards Alcester and a silver Citroen Xsara Picasso estate which was travelling towards Great Alne.

The motorcyclist was pronounced dead at the scene.

The female driver of the Citroen and three passengers, all children, were treated at the scene by ambulance crews for minor injuries and the effects of shock.

No details about the man who died will be released until the formal identification process has been completed and all close relatives have been informed.

Officers investigating the incident would like to hear from anyone who witnessed it or saw either vehicle and the manner in which they were being driven before the collision occurred.

Police Authority and Force Response to Government Comprehensive Spending Review

Chancellor George Osborne today (Wednesday, October 20) set out the Government's four-year public spending plans in the Comprehensive Spending Review.

The spending review is a Treasury-led process to allocate resources across all Government departments according to Government priorities.

This review covers the four years from 2011/12 to 2014/15 and today the Treasury highlighted its departmental allocations, this included funding for the areas of responsibility held by the Home Office.

Warwickshire Police is funded by central government grants and Council Tax. The Spending Review 2010 states that "Central government police funding will reduce by 20 per cent in real terms by 2014-15". This was announced as an average of four per cent reduction each year. But at this time individual police forces, including Warwickshire Police, do not know how this will directly affect local settlements and it would be inappropriate to speculate about what this may or may not translate to in real financial terms at a local level.

What we do know for certain is that Warwickshire Police must reduce its budget to remain affordable, acceptable and sustainable.

Our current reduction target is £13.4 million before any additional savings are required as a result of the Comprehensive Spending Review. The full effect of which will probably not be known until early December and we will not speculate on cuts, workforce numbers or other matters prior to knowing the full picture.

In response to any cuts in our budget we will continue to ensure that we provide the maximum protection possible within the resources available.

The top three issues raised at the Community Forum held at Welford on Avon Junior School on 21st September 2010 were...

1. **Anti Social Use of Vehicles.** To carry out six half-hour roadside checks focusing on modifications that give rise to anti social behaviour e.g. noisy exhausts etc, in addition the team will proactively seek out vehicles being used in an anti social manner with a view to issuing Section 59 warnings. 3/6 checks done to date.
2. **Speeding through Welford on Avon Village.** To carry out 8 half hour speed checks in Welford on Avon village. 2/8 done so far.
3. **Speeding through Luddington village.** To carry out 8 half hour speed checks in Luddington village. 3/8 done so far.

MONTHLY MESSAGE:

Incidents of Criminal Damage fall by 10.6% in Stratford District.

Police in Stratford District are pleased to report that incidents of criminal damage have fallen by 10.6%. Between April 1 and September 30, 2010 there were 524 incidents of criminal damage, compared to 586 during the same period in 2009.

Chief Inspector Ian Whiting, Stratford District Commander said: "This reduction shows that police in Stratford District, working with other members of Stratford's Community Safety Partnership, take the public's concern over criminal damage seriously and recognise the impact of this crime on individuals. Warwickshire Police remains committed to protecting communities from harm."
