# 3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PLANNING MEETING HELD ON MONDAY $8^{TH}$ OCTOBER 2012

Cllr. Hiscocks advised he that, although he had attended the meeting, he had been omitted from the Minutes. Cllr. Gerrard proposed that, subject to Cllr. Hiscocks being included in the Minutes as having attended the meeting, they be, accepted as being accurate and signed by the Chairman.

#### 4. PUBLIC FORUM

- Some concern was expressed by a resident regarding the proposed affordable development on Grafton Lane. She pointed out that
  - o Grafton Lane is a traffic nightmare with many using it as a shortcut to Stratford and the A46
  - o Low water pressure

The Chairman replied that =whilst the Council understood these issues, the recent House Survey, dated August 2012, had identified the need for 39 affordable houses in Bidford, and the Parish Council was trying to meet this demand.

He added that the proposal for Grafton Lane was for a mixed development and there would be a full public consultation sometime n January 2013.

The Council also explained how the affordable housing system works within the District and confirmed this particular development would be limited to Bidford residents or those with Bidford connections.

#### 5. MATTER ARISING

#### TO RECEIVE

o Verbal report on the Planning Committee decision in respect of the planning application for a development of 46 dwellings on land east of Waterloo Road Cllr. Fleming had attended and objected to the development on behalf of the Parish Council, as did the Ward Members. The planning officer, who had recommended that the development be granted permission, pointed out to the planning committee that in the event it refused permission, it would go to appeal which the developers would surely win, at some financial cost to SDC.

The vote was 4 in favour and 4 against – in view of this the Chairman had the casting vote which was to grant.

**RESOLVED** to note the report

o Verbal report on the Planning Appeal in respect of Land to the North of 18 Salford Road

The Clerk, who had attended all 5 sessions, gave the report. The decision is finely balanced between the house supply need and the highways issue. Regrettably, the appellants, had been allowed to present a revised Road Safety Audit, which took into account all the issues raised by the Inspector. It is still uncertain whether or not the Inspector will accept this, but it does mean a further delay as both parties continue written representations.

O Verbal report on the Planning Committee decision in respect of the outline planning application for development of 45 dwellings on Land North of Bramley Way Cllr. Mrs Keeley had attended the meeting on behalf of the Parish Council and opposed the development, as did the Ward Members.

After 52 minutes considering the application, the committee voted 4 in favour, 5 against with 1 abstention – so the decision was to refuse permission.

However, the Parish Council stressed this would not be the end as the applicants were likely to appeal this decision. **RESOLVED** to note the report
