## **BURGLARY DWELLING**

At approximately 12:00 hours on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> May a suspicious male, driving a green motor vehicle, called on an elderly lady in Grafton Lane, Bidford claiming he was from Dynord and needed to turn off the water. Male has been denied access to the premises by the IP and stated he would come back later.

Male has been described as white, between 25 and 30 years old with dark hair and round features.
