Warwickshire Police welcomes new PCSO

Inspector Nav Malik is pleased to welcome a new arrival to the Alcester sector policing team. Police Community Support Officer Anita Mckinley has recently joined the sector and takes the number of PCSO's in the area up to four. Anita will now take up the permanent role as PCSO for Alcester, working with Community Beat Officer Steve Timms. Anita should soon become a local face in and around the Alcester area and will be on hand to help PC Timms and other officers tackle issues of concern in our communities.

The primary role of the PCSO's is to provide high visibility foot patrols and to tackle community issues that affect people's quality of life such as anti-social behaviour and nuisance youths.

They liaise with a number of other agencies such as the council to resolve ongoing problems, and gather intelligence for the force.

PCSO's also play an important role in stimulating interest and enthusiasm for Neighbourhood Watch teams and encouraging people to play an active part in keeping their communities safe by keeping a watchful eye on each other's property.

"Paul, Martin, Tristain and Anita provide a very valuable service." Said Alcester Inspector Nav Malik "By attending local meetings and being a prominent force in the area our PCSO's are able to directly address community issues and continue to help reducing the fear of crime. Whilst we still continue to develop their role in Warwickshire, I am sure many people will benefit from their presence in our towns and villages".



CRIME PREVENTION

Towards the end of May 2005 the IP has had a leaflet through her door from what she believed was a landscape gardening company, calling themselves "Oak trees Landscapes". The IP has then phoned the company to book an appointment. Two male offenders have then attended the IP's premises and given her a quote for work to be done as well as showing her a portfolio of their work. Around two weeks later the two men have returned to the premises and informed the IP that materials were being delivered and that she needed to pay £900.00 cash to the delivery driver. The lady has then gone and withdrawn this money. On her return the two men have told the IP that they needed to pay the delivery driver at the depot. The two men have then taken the money and left and did not return. The IP has called the company and they have informed her that everything was ok, however they still did not return. The IP has then called the company again and received no answer.

If you are in any doubt **NEVER** hand over any money.
