CRIME IN YOUR AREA

BURGLARY

- Burglaries of outbuildings and sheds have fallen in July. The 3 recorded incidents refer to 2 sheds and 1 Office space. Please make sure that suitable security is fitted to parts of your property that contain gardening items, bikes and cars.
- Our 1 Burglary Dwelling incidents refers to a house in Dunnington.

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

- Criminal Damage is slightly up this month. Incidents include a car being sprayed with gold paint in Alcester. A car windscreen being smashed in Alcester and House windows being damaged in Bidford.
- A good percentage of the incidents reported relate to domestic and neighbour disputes.

THEFTS

- 3 of the incidents reported refer to 'shop lifting' at Waitrose in Alcester and Budgens in Bidford.
- Another Catalytic Converter has been stolen in Kings Coughton.

- On the 16th July an Alabaster Carving was stolen from St Mary's Church in Kinwarton. This is an unusual theft of a very unique piece. We also had a theft from the Chapel in Luddington a few weeks ago. Please report any suspicious activity near any such buildings.
- For another month running the Barclays Card Cash Point in High Street Alcester has been targeted by thieves. Each time they have removed the anti-skimming device fitted to the machine. Each time 2 males in their early 20's have been caught on the internal CCTV. The times they have attacked the machine this month has been between 1.30am and 05.15am. If you are out and about in the early morning and see any suspicious activity near to any of our cash points, please ring 101.

ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (PERSONS AND VEHICLES)

- Reports of rowdy and anti-social behaviour remain steady. 6 of the reports are directly involving vehicles.
- If you see a vehicle, including motorcycles acting in an anti-social behaviour <u>and</u> <u>its safe to do so</u> please make a note of the registration number, description of the vehicle and its occupants. We can then take any suitable action against the driver and owners.

What else has been happening....?

Members from the Alcester South SNT and other officers from around the county deal with a myriad of other incidents on our area. CRIME PREVENTION AND INFORMATION




Over the last few weeks we have experienced some very high temperatures and actual signs of Summer! To enjoy the weather we have kept windows and doors open.

This unfortunately presents an ideal opportunity for Burglars. Our advice is to make sure all windows and doors are shut and locked when the area is unattended, especially at night or when you are away.

Theft from vehicles is considerably low on the Alcester South area, but is a problem in other parts of the County and surrounding areas. Simple crime prevention techniques will make sure that it remains low in our area. We advise:

*Always close and lock windows and doors, even if just leaving the car for a few minutes. *Always remove from view items of electrical equipment, coats, handbags and mobile phones.*Try and park your car in open view of the public and in areas covered by street lights and CCTV. *Use security markings.

Good News

- ❖ The fundraising for the Alcester Gaming Project has been going well. Three TV sets have been purchased at a discount rate from a local business on the Arden Forest Industrial Estate. The plan now is to source the necessary gaming equipment from a local retailer at a similar rate − The project will then be up and running.
- ❖ We will be running a Community Speedwatch Course in August following a large interest in joining from residents in and around Welford and Bidford.
- ❖ A youth in Bidford successfully completed his Restorative Justice by litter picking in the area. The youth had been found stealing from Budgens.
- PCSO Becky Morris completed a school talk to the whole of Bidford Primary on the 12th July about basic crime prevention for young people.
- ❖ At 2250 hours on Friday 27th July, 2012 a 20 year old Bidford youth was stop checked by officers from Alcester South SNT. He was sat in a car parked up in a secluded location in Coughton. Due to the strong smell of cannabis from within the vehicle the male was found to be in possession of a small amount of herbal cannabis. The male admitted possession of a controlled drug and received an official cannabis street warning.
