## Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

For operational and privacy reasons not all the incidents that occur on the Alcester area are listed in this report, although they are recorded on police systems. Please remember to report any anti-social behaviour, suspicious activity, or crimes to us as soon as possible - this can be done via the 101 and 999 telephone numbers or if not an emergency via our online reporting forms that can be found on our website. If you have any information or cctv footage that may relate to the incidents listed, please contact us.

### ALCESTER

- \*Vehicle Crime. Payne Drive. White Range Rover stolen without key. Intel from Council CCTV suggest that the Range Rover went northbound on the A435 with two other possible stolen cars. One a Silver Jaguar (From Studley) and the other a Blue Jaguar. 6.20pm Saturday 23rd March. 0321 23/03/2024

- Assault on Emergency Worker – Ambulance Crew. High Street. While dealing with an incident a male has become verbally abusive telling the ambulance crew to move the ambulance so he could get passed. This male has then entered the ambulance and has struggled with a member of the crew who as a result been injured. The offender is described as a white male, 18 to 25 years, wearing a white puffa jacket and dark coloured trousers. There was a van behind the ambulance at the time, but its unknown if this was involved and may be a witness. Around 7.50pm Friday 22nd March. 0346 22/03/2024

- Suspicious Circumstances. Allendale Avenue. Ford Ranger parked in the street with its doors open. Caller concerned that it had been broken into. 1.50am Sunday 24th March. 0026 24/03/2024
- \*Vehicle Crime. Payne Drive, Alcester. White Range Rover stolen without key. Intel from Council CCTV suggest that the Range Rover went northbound through Studley on the A435 with two other possible stolen cars. One a Silver Jaguar (From Studley) and the other a Blue Jaguar. 6.20pm Saturday 23rd March. 0321 23/03/2024. It is believed after the incident was put onto local Studley social media, a couple of people may have seen the offenders, although nothing was reported to the police at the time. Any witnesses to this incident or anyone with information that has not spoken to the police already can contact Crimestoppers on 0800555111, use the online Crimestoppers reporting form or can contact the police on 101.
- Attempt Robbery / Attempt Kidnapping. Offences to be confirmed from ongoing investigations. Allendale Crescent. The injured party was sat in his vehicle when a dark coloured car drew up alongside. There were three males with face coverings in this vehicle, one was carrying a weapon. They told the IP to get into their car and they drove him towards the direction of Studley Castle where they asked him to hand over his car keys. There was then an altercation, and the IP was assaulted. Continued.....

Studley Continued.....The offenders then drove off leaving the IP on the floor. The IP's car was not stolen. The offence was reported to police later in the day. The incident was later put onto local social media by members of the public with a couple of people suggesting they had also seen a suspicious vehicle with males inside wearing balaclavas. None of these incidents have currently been reported to police (at time of this report). Any witnesses to this incident or anyone with information can contact Crimestoppers on 0800555111, use the online Crimestoppers reporting form or can contact the police on 101 quoting the incident number 0346 20/03/2024. Incident occurred at approximately 1.10pm Wednesday 20th March.

- Theft. Store. Male shoplifter detained by staff. Police attended and dealt with the male at the scene by interview etc. Daytime Wednesday 20th March. 0093 20/03/2024
- Suspicious Circumstances. Rowland Avenue / Green Close. Two males seen in parked car watching nearby houses. The first time they were in a dark coloured car, the second time (Morning of 18th March) they were in a grey coloured car. Caller concerned regards their motives. 0028 20/03/2024

### **Reporting Incidents**

If you see or hear anything you believe to be suspicious, especially behaviour that may be the result of, or the lead up to a possible crime, please report to us on 101 or 999 as necessary. We appreciate that phone line may be busy depending on demand, but we would like to know in real time so the appropriate action can be made.

Descriptions of persons involved, and the registration numbers and descriptions of vehicles involved will assist us locating offenders at the time or in the future.

We do not actively monitor local Facebook groups.

### **Witnesses sought to two-vehicle collision - Tanworth in Arden**

Investigating officers are appealing for witnesses to a two-vehicle collision near Tanworth-in-Arden. It happened at the junction of Broad Lane and Beoley Lane around 11pm on Saturday (16 March) and involved a grey Audi Estate and a black BMW motorbike. The motorcyclist – a man in his 50s – was taken to hospital with leg and shoulder injuries that are not believed to be life-threatening. The driver and passengers in the Audi were uninjured. Enquiries are currently ongoing, but police would like to speak with any witnesses to the incident or people who saw the vehicles and the manner in which they were being driven prior to the collision. Anyone with information is asked to contact the force quoting incident number 118 of 16 March.

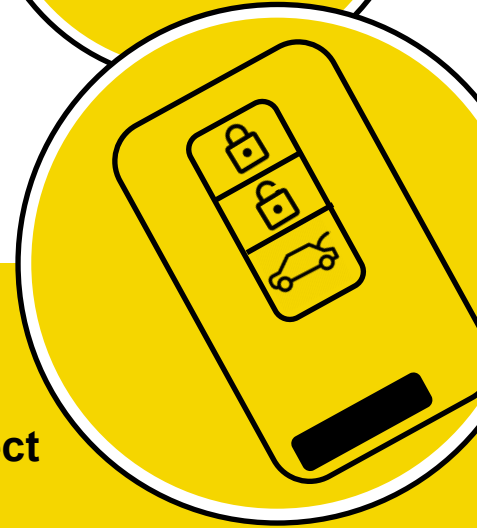
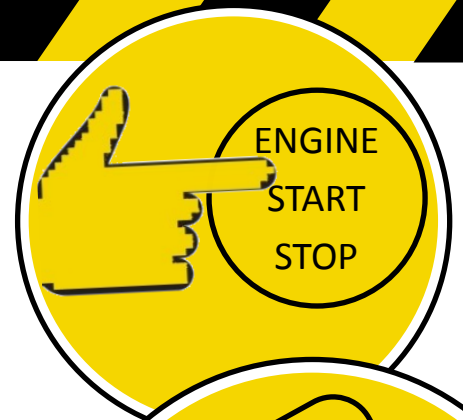

# HELP STOP KEYLESS CAR THEFT



Thieves can steal your keyless car by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your starting device in order to start your vehicle. Help to protect your vehicle.

- Make sure your car is properly locked and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock, driveway parking post or wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals
- Fit a tracking device
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal
- Remove the batteries from your spare keys

**And remember, be on the lookout for people acting suspiciously and report it by calling 999.**
